The life-saving policy of “women and children first” highlighted the fact that true equality meant equal risk of life with men in times of adversity. 	Outdoor Survival	Skill Builders 1	Research Survivor Stories from the <i>Titanic</i> disaster. Discuss the importance of the determination to survive.
